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IGG FOOD ALLERGY TEST INSTRUCTIONS GREAT PLAINS LABORATORY

Test Materials Include:

Great Plains Laboratory, Inc. Test Requisition Form (packet)

Great Plains Laboratory, Inc. Test Kit (small white box)

You will need to have your blood drawn for this test.

Please call your PCP/GP or local urgent care/hospitals to see if they will draw the blood for you. There are instructions inside the test kit for the phlebotomist.

You only need to fill out the very first page of the packet. I have done everything else in the packet that needs to be done. If you choose to have this test billed to your insurance, please include your insurance information in the appropriate section of the requisition form.

*This test may or may not be covered by your insurance, which that information is for you to call your insurance and find out. CorePsych **will not** do pre-authorizations with your insurance company for any testing. Your insurance company will most likely ask for the following information:*

Name of test: **IgG Food Allergy Test w/Candida (serum)**

CPT or Procedure codes: 86001 – 93 units, 86628 and 86671

ICD-9 or Diagnosis code: 279.03

If your insurance does not cover this test, or you choose to pay out of pocket for this test, the cost would be \$219.00. That payment should be submitted to Great Plains Laboratory, Inc. with your blood sample.

If you choose to have this test submitted to your insurance company by Great Plains and your insurance does **not** cover this test, you will then be responsible for \$325.00 instead of the “cash” price of \$219.00.
